





Summary document for the Research ABC project

(Research: Allied Health Professions (AHPs) Building Capacity Across the Black Country)

Funding and aim of the project:

The project is funded by West Midlands Clinical Research Network (CRN) improvement and innovation strategic funding to enable the Black Country integrated care system (ICS) to address the four domains: capacity, capability, context and culture to resource and support ongoing AHP research.

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Research ABC team

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The project will be run across the Black Country place-based partnerships in Dudley Sandwell, Walsall, and Wolverhampton. The project with include AHPs employed or hosted by one of the six secondary care organisations.

There will be five phases to the project to be completed over eight months (please, see flowchart and Gantt chart for details and timings):

- 1) **Preparation:** The team will prepare for collecting baseline information
- 2) Baseline assessment and analysis:
- **a) Individual:** We will collect data about research activity and training needs for AHPs in the Black Country and plan to implement The Clinicians' Skills, Capability, and Organisational Research Readiness (SCORR) Tool (Iles-Smith et al, 2019) to be used with AHPs as part of the appraisal process. This will allow individual AHPs to self-assess their research readiness and will enable structured conversations with line managers to support the development of research objectives.
- **b) Trust level:** Research metrics e.g., number of peer review publications written, poster/oral presentations etc. will be collected.
- **3) Research development strategies:** Various methods will be facilitated to assist with developing research skills and capability e.g., critical appraised topic (CAT) groups, journal clubs, workshops etc. Networking will also be actively facilitated.
- 4) Post Research ABC project evaluation: On completion of the project.







5) Report: Report to be submitted who funded the project.


