If I still need my blue inhaler regularly for five days after discharge from hospital, I must be taken to the GP surgery or attend my local urgent care centre or A&E for a doctor to review my symptoms. If I need 10 puffs of my blue inhaler and this does not help my symptoms I need to go to A&E.
