Dr. Hans Clean says "The prevention of infection is a major priority in all healthcare and everyone has a part to play.

- If you have symptoms of diarrhoea and vomiting stay at home and do not visit relatives that are vulnerable in hospital or in residential care. You will spread the illness.
- Keep the environment clean and safe. Let's work together to keep it that way. Prevention is better than cure".



This leaflet has been written to help you understand more about the Specialist Palliative Care Team, the services we provide and how we can support you.

What is palliative care?

Palliative care aims to improve or maintain your quality of life and independence when you have an illness that is not likely to be cured. We are here to support you, your relatives and carers. You may meet us soon after you have been diagnosed or at any stage of your illness.

The team?

The Team includes health care professionals that specialise in palliative care. The Team provides advice and help to you and the Doctors and Nurses looking after you whilst you are in hospital.

The Team meets weekly to discuss your care.

Present at the team meeting are:-

- Medical team members (Consultant and Specialty Registrar)
- Clinical Nurse Specialists
- Occupational Therapists
- Physiotherapists
- Social Workers
- Hospital Chaplain

If you would like to see a member of our team please ask one of the Doctors or Nurses looking after you to refer you.

How can The Team help you?

- Advise you and the team of Doctors and Nurses looking after you about how best to manage your pain and other symptoms
- Offer you and your relatives / carers emotional support

- Try to help you remain as active and independent as possible by supporting you with rehabilitation, walking, breathing techniques and all activities of daily living
- Work with others to enable the smooth running of your care
- Help arrange for equipment and services that you might need when you go home

How are we involved in your care?

Doctors and Nurses looking after you on the ward take overall responsibility for your care. The SPCT help advise them on the specialist care required while you are in hospital. We also liaise with hospice / community palliative care services if you are under their care when at home.

The Department of Spiritual and Pastoral Care

Chaplains and other faith representatives are available at all times to offer pastoral and spiritual care to everyone. Please ask a member of staff to contact them or ask for their patient information leaflet.

Will my personal information be protected?

Yes. All aspects of information about your care will be treated in a confidential manner. Only members of the team looking after you will have knowledge of your care.
