

Colonic Transit Study

Radiology

Introduction

This leaflet is for patients considering the Colonic Transit study. It outlines what the study is, what the procedure involves, its benefits, risks and possible side effects.

Description

A Colonic Transit study is a diagnostic test used to find out how long it takes faeces (waste matter) to pass through your colon (large bowel). You will be required to swallow a small capsule (which is about the size of a normal tablet) filled with very tiny plastic markers. These markers will pass through your bowel and show up on X-ray.

Consent

This is a standard X-ray diagnostic examination and formal, written consent is not required.

Benefits'

This is a diagnostic test to assess how long waste matter takes to pass through your large bowel.

Risks

There are no side effects to taking the capsule.

Radiation: There are some risks involved with the use of X-rays. The overriding concern of your doctor and Radiology is to ensure that when radiation is used the benefits from making the right diagnosis outweigh any small risk involved.

Radiologists / Radiographers who perform the examination are trained to ensure that the radiation dose associated with the examination is always kept to a minimum.

If you have further questions about the risk of exposure to radiation, please talk to the radiographer before your X-ray.

Please contact the X-ray Department as soon as you receive this appointment if you think you may be pregnant.

Alternatives

There are currently no alternative tests for this at this hospital.

Before the examination

You will be asked to stop taking all laxatives for at least a week before you take the capsule. Otherwise you can eat and drink normally.

On the day of the examination

Day 1 (Saturday) before your appointment: After a week without laxatives, take the capsule at 9am with water. Do not chew them. Do not take any laxatives until after the examination.

Day 5 (Wednesday) The day of your appointment: Attend New Cross Radiology department or Cannock X-ray department as indicated on your appointment letter for an abdominal X-ray examination to be completed.

How long will it take?

The abdominal X-ray takes approximately 10 mins to complete.

Diabetic patients

No special requirements.

After the examination?

After the examination you can go home. You may eat and drink as normal. You can restart taking laxatives as previously advised.

When will I get the results?

The results will be sent to your Consultant who will discuss them with you at your next out-patients appointment.

If you do not attend for the examination, your request will be returned to your Consultant for review and the appointment will be recorded as you 'Did not attend'. If the appointment you have been given is not suitable please contact the department on one of the below telephone numbers to change it BEFORE you take the capsule.

Student training

A student Radiographer may be present during the examination. If you would prefer them not to be present, please let the Radiographer know at the time.

If you have any special needs, which are likely to affect your examination, please contact the Radiology / X-ray department.
