

# Use of Surgical Instruments in Podiatry

**Podiatry** 

The prevention of infection is a major priority in all healthcare and everyone has a part to play.

# Introduction

Podiatrists and podiatry clinical staff including undergraduate and apprentice podiatrists are trained to use a variety of surgical instruments; these include items such as scalpels and nail clippers.

# Why would a podiatrist need to use them on my foot?

Your podiatrist will discuss your management or treatment plan with you before they undertake any physical treatment and will ask for your consent to do so.

Each patient is different, and your podiatrist may need to use one type of surgical instrument or lots of different types. These instruments are used to remove hard skin (callus) and deeper corns which helps to reduce pain and protect your skin from ulceration. We also use surgical instruments when undertaking toenail surgery and to remove hard skin or dead tissue from around an ulceration. These will often cause bleeding, but your podiatrist will give you further information should you suffer with ingrowing toenails or ulcerations.

# Is treatment painful?

All treatments come with the risk of pain or discomfort. Each patient has a different tolerance to pain, this can be different for the same patient at each visit. Your podiatrist will do everything they can to minimise any pain or discomfort during treatment.

It is your decision not to have treatment, however if you decide against an advised course of treatment there is a risk that the condition you presented with could worsen and deteriorate.

# Could the podiatrist cut me if they use surgical instruments on me?

All treatments using surgical instruments come with a risk of causing a cut and using sharp instruments on fragile skin can place you at risk of bleeding.

Most of these cuts are minor and can be treated with a simple dressing which will need to be kept dry and in place for 24-48 hours. Should this happen, the podiatrist will advise you on what to do and when to remove your dressing.

# Could I get an infection if I am cut?

Infections are extremely rare, however there is an increased chance of infection if you do not follow the podiatrist or podiatry team's instructions.

All the surgical instruments used within the department are sterile at the time of opening, so the risk of infection is minimal from these instruments.
